**Selection Criteria and Process**

**Process:**

The Muriel Ramm Science Bursary is awarded based on academic merit and financial need. Eligible students must complete the following two steps:

- 1) apply for the Muriel Ramm Science Bursary via the Faculty of Science website at: <https://science.unimelb.edu.au/scholarships> and search under Ramm. Apply through the **Apply Now** link. Your application must include a cover letter describing your reasons for applying for a Muriel Ramm Science Bursary and the potential impact of the award, your CV, a copy of your academic transcript and a copy of your enrolment record at Melbourne.
- 2) apply for a financial need assessment via the University of Melbourne's Student Grants online application link at: [Student Grant application](#) by the due date.

**Both applications must be submitted by 15 March 2016.**

**Eligibility:**

Students enrolled in 2016 in the Faculty of Science entering the Bachelor of Science (Honours), the Advanced Graduate Diploma in Science, or the first year of a Master of Science are eligible to apply, provided they are from one of the following schools:

**BioSciences; Chemistry; Earth Sciences; Ecosystem & Forest Sciences; Geography;  
Mathematics & Statistics; Physics**

- Applicants must be commencing their course in first semester 2016 or have commenced in second semester 2015.
- Recipients of scholarships that include an allowance or other payment over and above the value of a fee-based place from the University are not eligible to apply.
- The bursary is awarded to the candidate most likely to benefit academically from the additional funds. The selection committee will consider applications based on demonstrable financial need and academic merit.

**Application checklist**

- Completed application form via the Faculty of Science (lodging your application for the Bursary), including a cover letter, your CV and copy of your academic transcript (copy only).
- Completed application for a financial aid assessment via the University of Melbourne Student Grants online application link.
